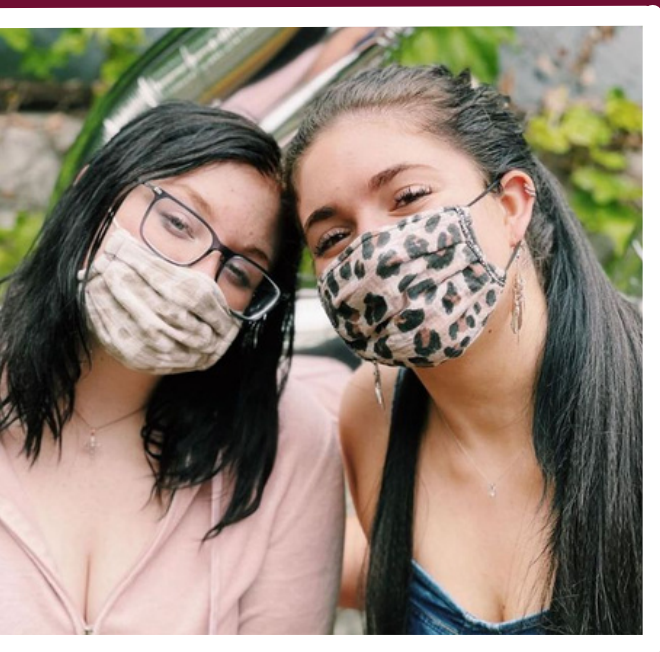

Grants

One way that the Foundation aims to achieve its mission and vision is by providing educational funding. Our longest standing grant, the Leadership Education and Programming (LEAP) grant, allows the Foundation to provide gifts to Phi Sigma Rho to fund educational and leadership sessions that help sisters of Phi Sigma Rho hone their leadership skills, exercise the sorority's fundamental concepts, and grow as strong women and professionals. In 2021, the Phi Sigma Rho Foundation provided a grant to help fund the Phi Sigma Rho National Convention in July 2021. The convention was held virtually. In attendance were 222 actives and 65 alumnae.

Total Grant Awarded: \$7,721.79.

In 2022, we look to have our first year with two new grant applications available - the EDGE and DreamGirls Grants. The EDGE Grant will benefit individuals and teams of Phi Rhos that are working on projects that develop project management and hands-on technical learning, while the DreamGirls grant will benefit the next generation of women in STEM by funding DreamGirls programs hosted by Phi Sigma Rho organizations at the national and local level.

Available Scholarships

We currently offer six \$1,000 scholarships to undergraduate and graduate Phi Sigma Rho Members. Scholarship applications open October 1st each, and are due the following March 1st. To date, the Phi Sigma Rho Foundation has given 53 scholarships since 2005.

Merit Scholarship

The Merit Scholarship is given to a well-rounded sister who has excelled academically, as well as promoting the ideals of the sisterhood by being a positive influence through their chapter and community as a representative of Phi Sigma Rho.

Leadership Scholarship

The Leadership Scholarship is given to a sister who is a leader in her chapter and community. She demonstrates this through encouragement and mentorship of others and through meaningful participation in Phi Sigma Rho.

Philanthropy & Service Scholarship

The Philanthropy & Service Scholarship is given to a sister who actively supports and participates in acts of philanthropy and service. She shows this through her acts of community service, leadership skills, volunteerism, and meaningful participation in Phi Sigma Rho and/or other activities.

Sarah Rogers McClure Memorial Scholarship

The Sarah Rogers McClure Memorial Scholarship is given to recognize a sister who always puts others first and takes action because it is the right thing to do, not for attention or personal gains. The ideal recipient will also be active in Phi Sigma Rho and participate in community service or other meaningful activities.

Anne Louise Roach Legacy Scholarship

This scholarship was created to recognize the first traditional mother-daughter legacy of Phi Sigma Rho between Jennifer and Anne Roach. The ideal recipient will personify what it means to be a Phi Rho through her acts of friendship, dedication to scholarship, and display of encouragement. The recipient of this scholarship must be a legacy member and must currently be pursuing an undergraduate or graduate degree in engineering or engineering technology.

Francis J. Monigan Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was created to celebrate the legacy of Francis J. Monigan, father of Phi Sigma Rho Gamma Chapter Alumna Heather Monigan. Selection of this scholarship will be made to recognize a sister who demonstrates the values Mr. Monigan held most important – grit, compassion, and a desire for helping others. The ideal recipient will show these values as well as a commitment to engineering and Phi Sigma Rho.

Light the Night is an annual fundraiser through the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society, the largest voluntary health organization to provide funds for research, finding cures, and providing access to treatments for blood cancer patients. Via this campaign, active and alumnae chapters unite to fundraise for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society and walk in their local Light the Night walk, bringing light to darkness. While walks may have looked a little different in 2020 and 2021, we appreciate the continued support towards by our chapters and alumnae to this cause!

The chapters raised **\$38,077** in 2021, and **\$210,074** since 2015 collectively!

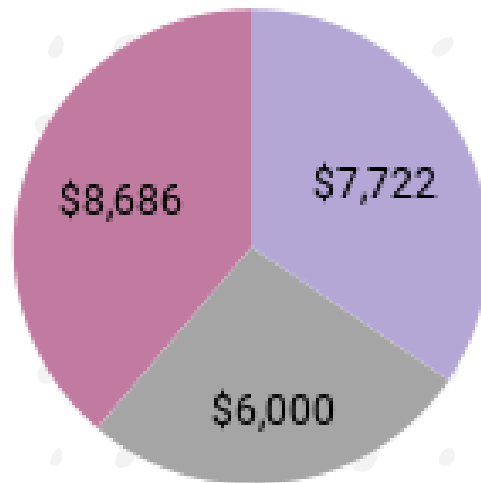

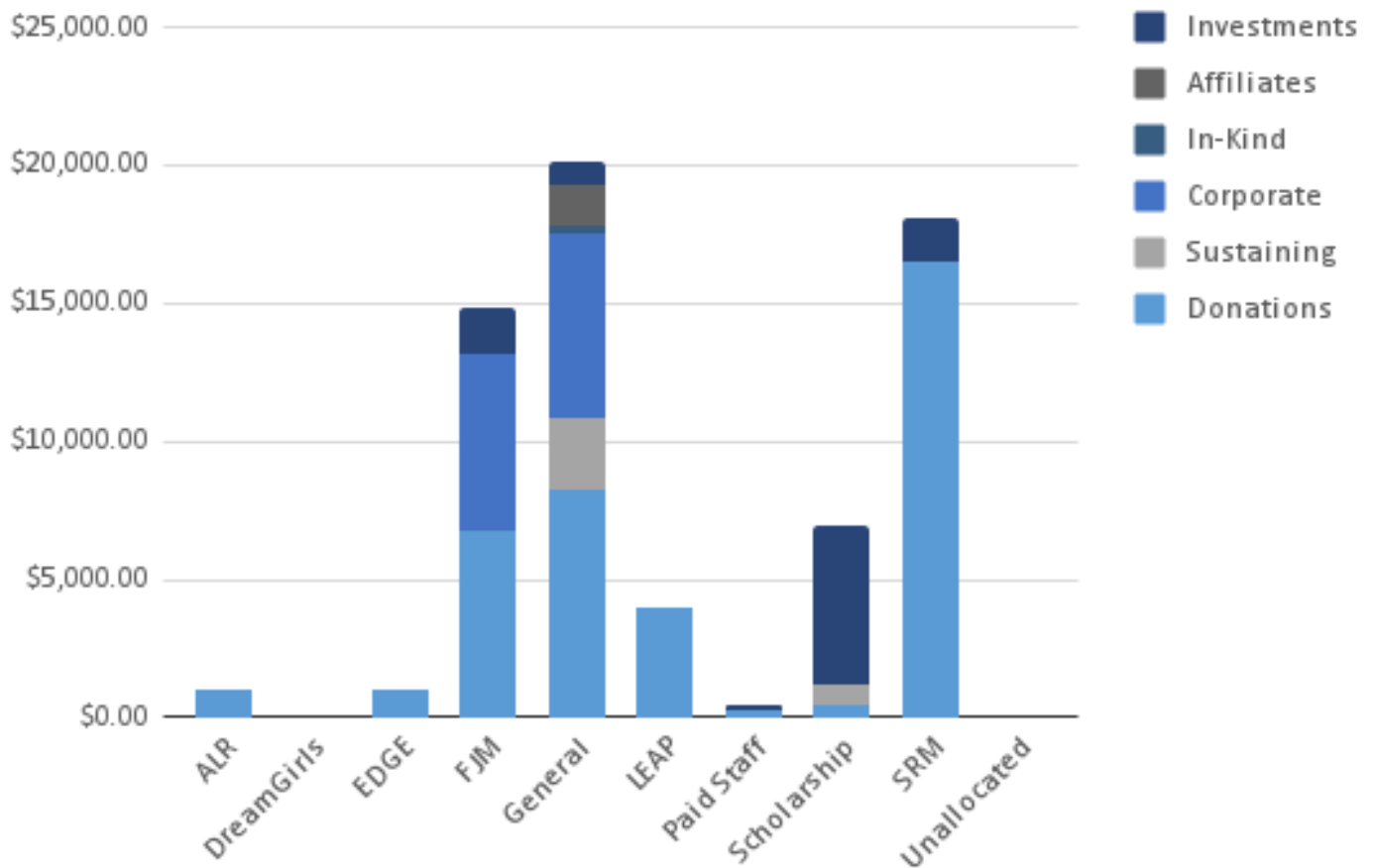
