

# Building the Future Together

## President's Message

---The motto of the Foundation is an incredible set of words that simply

state what we are doing as a team of volunteers--working together to build the future of the Foundation and provide for the Sorority, Actives, Alumnae, and future engineers. As an engineer, to build something means making a set of plans to follow, evaluating the construction, and assessing how close we are to the final product. With this report, we will take a few minutes to talk about our plans, our progress, and our assessment.

Upon joining the Foundation in July 2007, it was clear to me that we needed more volunteers, and more revenue to pay our debts, grant funds to the Sorority and to give scholarships. These are all things that a normal charity would do, and they are a measure of our mission. While we did not have a formal strategy approved by the Board, we had a new team of fired up volunteers who were ready for the challenge. While I focused setting up our operations and recruiting volunteers, the other volunteers focused on revenue generation. Since then, we have tripled the number of Foundation volunteers who are involved, and maintain close ties with past Board members who continue to support the Foundation operations. We have repaid our debts and continue to generate positive revenue that we are now granting to the Sorority. In addition, we have been able to increase the number of scholarships we are giving each year.

Building onto what we have now means taking the time to measure our success and see how far we have come to the present. We are committed to fund grants that the Sorority asks from us. We were able to grant money towards the LEAP Workshops which cover costs associated with the National Convention and Leadership Conference. We have also granted money to cover the special LEAP events held at individual chapters. Since 2007, over \$5000 has been granted to the Sorority for programming. The Sorority has worked to provide excellent programming for our members. With the increasing support of our donors, we

will be able to continue to support our membership through programs that the Sorority believes will benefit our sisterhood.

We have made a commitment to fund more than one scholarship each year, and are pleased to be able to give four scholarships this year. It is important for us to be able to support our members as they aspire for higher and continuing education.

Building this future means that we must have a plan so that we know what we are building. We are preparing to have a more formal Strategic Plan which we update on a regular basis. It is important for us to have a set of goals that we can use to measure ourselves, and that we review it regularly to make sure we are always making progress towards the final product.

We are working on a program to partner with our chapters in philanthropy. We hope to be able to put that in place in 2011. This will mean more volunteer opportunities and a larger organization, but we see the benefit to both Sorority and Foundation.

Our Board members and Volunteers are the biggest asset to the organization and deserve the most praise and thanks for the incredible successes in the recent past. Most important is the continuing commitment year after year, and the willingness to even serve past their terms.



Our Board has been mostly stable, and we continue to recruit new volunteers into Chairperson positions as a means to develop new Officers and Board Members as the organizational structure continues to grow.

Our Final Product: What our final product is keeps changing. We have built something small, but it is sustaining. And, our Board members are evaluating what we want to build next... what to build onto that small but sustaining piece. As our Sorority develops programming for members, we will continue to build up what we underwrite to benefit our sisterhood. We need to further define ourselves and our new projects, and keep reporting to you, our donors, what we have in the works. Stay tuned. Is it going to be an exciting unveiling of our future.

Serving as President of the Phi Sigma Rho Foundation, has been exciting and challenging for myself personally. However, it is the most rewarding gift that I give and that I get at each moment. The women who serve with me have passion and commitment to our organization, and that generates the passion and commitment for me to work through the challenging times. To them, I am forever thankful that they allowed me to lead them, and I am grateful for their service and friendship. We have built something incredible together, and that bond will be there forever.

# Treasurer



Even in a slow economy, the Foundation is moving forward and improving. We switched to a new book keeping program this year to better manage our budget and income. This is the first year we have




## FY09 Income

# VP of Development

Growth has been the unofficial theme for the Foundation over the past year. We've increased the number of Sorority grants, scholarships and volunteers working toward the Foundation's Mission. While charitable giving in 2009 fell by an estimated 75% across the country, donations to the Foundation increased by nearly 200%. This remarkable success in a dismal economy is thanks to two things: the generosity of our donors and the dedication of our volunteers.

The Foundation simply exposed the need for program funding and scholarships and Phi Rhos stepped up to the plate in a big way. Donations to the Scholarship Campaign at the end of 2009 will allow us to fund four additional scholarships in 2010. The 2009 Annual Campaign was the most successful in the Foundation's history, largely due to the tireless efforts of Foundation volunteer Christine Jackson (Alpha –

Alpha). Even our Active members and parents chipped in in the form of donations to the 2009 Chapter Challenge and 2009 Heart to Heart Campaigns, respectively. The 2009 E-Auction received generous support from Phi Rhos, businesses, professional sports teams and the general community.

I am excited by our financial successes over the past year and the Foundation is already working toward repeating – and hopefully exceeding – them in 2010. We all owe a thousand thanks to Foundation donors, who have demonstrated an unparalleled devotion through their selfless generosity. I'll leave you with one of my favorite quotes: "Money is like manure. It's not worth a thing unless it's spread around helping young things grow."


As Vice President of Programming, I am responsible for the Grant and Scholarship Programs. I am very proud of my development of the Grant process the Foundation now uses. Last year, the Foundation was able to grant the Sorority a total of \$4,445.02. This money was used to assist the Sorority to provide the Leadership Conference at National Convention, and for LEAP Workshops at the chapters. This year the Foundation has approved a Grant for the Leadership Conference in the amount of \$6,815.72. We are hoping to be able to raise the funds necessary to be able to grant the Sorority additional funds for the

regional LEAP conferences and for the chapter LEAP workshops.

As a student who relied on scholarships to attend school, the Scholarship program is very close to my heart. Last year, we awarded a total of \$1,000 in scholarships to two fantastic women. This year, we will be awarding even more scholarships thanks to the generous donations given to the Scholarship Campaign and through using Good Shop/Good Search. We have expanded the Scholarship program by adding a Scholarship Chair, Tammy Lowe. Tammy has worked hard to offer a new Leadership based scholarship, in addition to our Merit scholarship. We look forward to awarding this year's scholarship winners at the LEAP Conference this summer.

I want to thank everyone who helps the Foundation accomplish our mission of providing professional, educational, philanthropic, and leadership development opportunities through their generous donations of both time and money.
