#### Grants



# 2024 GRANT PROGRAMS



Foundation Grants impact more sisters each year than any other Foundation program. Our three unique grants provide a diverse range of development opportunities that impact our sisters and the greater community of women & underrepresented genders in STEM.



#### DreamGirls Grant

DreamGirls Grants will provide service and leadership opportunities for active and alumnae organizations of Phi Sigma Rho to support the next generation of women in engineering through engineering-focused programming for middle school girls. These programs will be transferable to schools, Scout trips, community shelters, and more! Dream Girls in Action and DreamDay programming through the DreamGirls Initiative are fundable programs through this grant opportunity.



#### **EDGE Grant**

The Engineering Development and Growth Experience (EDGE) grant program, inspired by Rosie & Alex Krob, supports collegiate Phi Rhos involved in hands-on science and engineering-based projects that will ultimately develop their leadership, financial, and project management skills, with fundable programs such as building go-karts, robotics, rocketry, and more. Through the EDGE Grant, the Foundation aims to create women leaders through hands-on experiences prior to entering their professional field.



#### **LEAP Grant**

Leadership Education and Programming (LEAP) Grants impacts more sisters each year than any other program. These grants cover the educational costs of conferences, conventions, regional meetings, and webinars hosted by the Sorority each year. Programs covered by the LEAP grant include speakers, panels, and leadership development workshops.

## Awarded to Phi Sigma Rho National Sorority

Phi Sigma Rho National Sorority utilized the LEAP grant to host a keynote session by professional speaker, Tina Rae VanSteenbergen at the 2024 Phi Sigma Rho Virtual Conference.

Tina session "What's Love Got To Do With It? Building Real Confidence in Sorority Life" taught actives and alums all about

confidence – what is is, why it's important, how to feel confident when it's not easy, and how to help our sisters be their most confident selves. She explained why we have to do more than simply love one another and that genuine empowerment is an action that is done on purpose.



# ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIPS Leadership Scholarship

Awarded to a sister who is a leader in their chapter and community. They demonstrate this through encouragement and mentorship of others and through meaningful participation in Phi Sigma Rho.

### Merit Scholarship

Given to a well-rounded sister who has excelled academically. They promote the ideals of the sisterhood by being a positive influence through their chapter and community as a representative of Phi Sigma Rho.

## Philanthropy & Service Scholarship

Recognizes a member who actively supports and participates in acts of philanthropy and service. They show this through their acts of community service, leadership skills, volunteerism, and meaningful participation in Phi Sigma Rho and other activities.

## Anne Louise Roach Legacy Scholarship

Made to recognize the first traditional mother-daughter legacy of Phi Sigma Rho between Jennifer and Anne Roach, the ideal recipient personifies what it means to be a Phi Rho through their acts of friendship, dedication to scholarship, & displays of encouragement. The recipient must be a legacy member as defined by Phi Sigma Rho sorority (daughter, mother, sister, cousin, aunt, or granddaughter of another member), and must currently be pursuing and undergraduate or graduate degree in engineering or engineering technology.

## Francis J. Monigan Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship celebrates the legacy of Francis J. Monigan, father of Phi Sigma Rho Gamma Chapter Alum, Heather Monigan. The recipient demonstrates the values Mr. Monigan held most important – grit, compassion, & a desire for helping others – as well as a commitment to engineering and Phi Sigma Rho. While all members are encouraged to apply, a strong preference is given to sisters who are pursuing a degree in an engineering discipline.

## Sarah Rogers McClure Memorial Scholarship

The Sarah Rogers McClure Memorial Scholarship recognizes a sister who always puts others first and takes action because it is the right thing to do, not for attention or personal gains. The ideal recipient will also be active in Phi Sigma Rho and participate in community service or other meaningful activities.

Celebrating 40 Years of Phi Sigma Rho




